### What is Community Habilitation

Community Habilitation is a Medicaid-funded program operated under OPWDD to provide one-on-one training to people with intellectual/developmental disabilities to develop or enhance the skills needed to live more independently in their homes or in the community.

### Who can Community Habilitation support?

Community Habilitation supports the person's life Plan and contains activities that are developed to help the person achieve his/her goals. It is then implemented through home visits and community activities as set by a schedule between the person with intellectual/developmental disabilities and the Residential Habilitation Specialist. Although a person can be authorized for the services regardless of where he/she lives, the service cannot take place in a certified location.

### **Different supports for Community Habilitation**

- Adaptive skill development
- Community inclusion and relationship building
- Development of social skills
- Travel training
- Money management
- Leisure skills

 Appropriate behavior development to help the individual access their community

### Who is Eligible?

To participate in Community Habilitation, the person needs to contact Office of People with Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD) intake team, have his/her eligibility confirmed and have that service recommended. For people already receiving supports, their care manager can assist them in obtaining Community Habilitation if appropriate.

Teacher of the Pathways to Graduation Program (P2G)

It is a pleasure to announce that we have a Pathways to Graduation Program (P2G) GED Program being taught by Mr. Mc Niff at our 401X Site. Students who meet the programs entry requirements have the opportunity to earn their High School Equivalency Diploma (HSE) and move on to careers and higher education. In the P2G program, students engage in a highly intensive high school equivalency curriculum. Students are supported by content-specialist teachers, paraprofessionals, related service providers and Mr. Mc Niff. Students who demonstrate competency in meeting content standards are recommended by their content-teachers to take the GED exam. While this is the first year of the P12X/D79 P2G program collaboration, we are confident that our partnership will be the create a bridge to success and opportunity for the students of our school community.
